## Before you start

- Carefully unpack the package and check if all components are present.
- Required for assembly: cordless drill, hammer and an wrench 13. The bit for the drill machine is included in the bag of screws.
- For the FCC 200, all fixing points with screws ( $4 \times 20$ and $4 \times 40$ ) should be glued using the wood construction glue provided for extra stability. One tube of glue is enough for three pieces of furniture.
- Due to the drying of the glue you can only coat the chair with oil after assembling it.


## Step 1 | Crossbar B

- Position side pieces $A$ with the curved sides up on a flat surface. Make sure the countersunk sides of the pre-drilled holes face outward.
- Insert crossbar B at the back of A into the middle notch, between the two deeper notches, with the countersunk holes facing up.
- Screw $B$ to $A$ with a $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screw on each side.


## Step 2 | Seat slats

- Place the seat slats $C$ in the notches on the front of $A$, with the countersunk screw holes facing up. Make sure that the outermost edges of the slats are precisely aligned with the outermost edges of the notches.
- Insert the slat with the logo into the second notch from the bottom.
- Secure the slats $C$ with a $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screw on both sides.
- Caution: do not attach part M yet.

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## Step 3 | Low back support

- Take two washers and two $8 \times 70 \mathrm{~mm}$ screws. Slide a washer over each screw.
- Take low back support D and place it in the center of side pieces A.
- Insert the screws through the large holes on the back of the parts A, from the outside to the inside.
- Attach D with the screws and make sure the plank fits perfectly.
- Caution: do not tighten D too tightly. The plank must be able to be rotated.



## Step 4 | Chair legs

- Place chair leg E against side piece A, with the slanted edge facing forward and the countersunk holes facing inward.
- Insert a bolt + washer from the outside into chair leg E, through the large hole in side piece A. Tighten it from the inside with a nut + washer.
- Repeat these steps on the other side of the chair.



## Step 5 | Cross boards F

- Grab cross boards F. These will be fastened underneath the chair legs E.
- Place a board Fin the notch on the front edges of E. Make sure the countersunk holes face forward. Screw $F$ in place with a $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screw on both sides.
- Repeat this step with the other board F on the back of chair legs E .

## Step 6 | Armrest carrier

- Fasten triangle G on chair leg E. The triangle extends 1.5 cm above E . The three marking points on $G$ should face forward.
- Screw down triangle $G$ with two $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screws. Use the two marking holes on the side of G as reference points.
- Take a hinge and attach it to $G$ with one small $4 \times 20$ in the center hole.
- Repeat these steps on the other side of the chair.



## Step 7 | Assemble position stopper

- Gather parts I, J and K to make the position stopper.
- Position parts I to the left and right of the upper backrestJ.
- Secure J by inserting an $8 \times 70$ screw + washer through the screw hole on top of I.
- Caution: do not overtighten, part J must remain movable.
- Place slat K at the bottom of parts I and fasten with two $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screws on each side.



## Step 8 | Instert the position stopper

- Hold the 'position stopper' facing the front of the reclining chair and set it upright into the last reclining position underneath the back legs. Caution: Slat K should fit perfectly in the notch for step 9.
- Rotate the upper backrest J until the notches are facing the front.


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## Step 9 | Armrest

- Take the end of the armrest $(H)$ and secure it to the 'position stopper'. Use two $8 \times 70$ screws and slide a washer over each screw. Insert the screws from the inside through the remaining low holes on top of the armrest.
- Make sure that the front legs of the chair remain upright and put the position stopper in the first notch. Leaving the armrest resting on the armrest support.
- Secure the armrest hinge with five $4 \times 20$ screws (two under the triangle and three under the armrest).



## Step 10 | Center back slat

- Lay down the back slats L1-7 in the correct order, starting with the longest slat in the middle. The slats should form an arch at the top.
- Place the center slat in the center notch from D and J with the countersunk holes facing forward.
- Make sure the slat fits exactly into the notch and is parallel to the bottom of the low back board $D$.
- Attach the longest, middle slat to D and then to J with a $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screw.



## Step 11 | Back slats

- Place the remaining back slats in their proper places.
- Fasten the slats at the bottom with $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screws.
- Make sure that the slats are properly located at the top and form a nice arch. The distance between the slats should be even. Use the notches as reference points.
- Fasten the slats at the top with $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screws.

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## Step 12 | Slat M

- Insert slat $M$ in the notches at the back of the seat, with the curved side facing back and the countersunk screw holes facing up.
- Secure M with a $4 \times 40 \mathrm{~mm}$ screw on both sides.


## Step 13 | Furniture gliders

Use a hammer to attach the 4 furniture glides under the chair legs.
